

QUALITY ASSURANCE & ETHICS AWARENESS TRAINING

NEW FOR 2019: In order to participate in a youth livestock program (excluding horse, cavies & dogs) at any California Fair, all exhibitors 9 years of age and older must obtain annual certification in the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) program. Those not certified are not eligible to participate at a California Fair. This is required of all Beef, Sheep, Swine, Poultry, Rabbit, Cavy, Goat (Meat, Dairy, Pygmy) exhibitors. All training is now online at YQCA.ORG. Certificates of Completion must be received with Online Entry Receipts no later than 4:00 pm on Monday, May 13th, 2019.

This year we attended the Central Youth Summit at Wonder Valley Ranch in Sanger CA, we were able to take 16 of our 4-H youth in Santa Barbara County. The theme of the summit was "Bee the Change" encouraging youth with educational material in the area of social awareness. They attended 7 sessions that focused around the theme of "Bee the Change," the sessions were Understanding Empathy,



Preparing for Interviews, Birds of a Feather (understanding what kind of personality type you are), Communicating without your Cellphone, Cyber Awareness, Bee a hero (teaching skills on how to end bullying), and finally Using your Voice to make Environmental Change (promoting civic engagement in your community). At the end of this very educational day the youth were able to have a leisure night and enjoy some fun games, movies, and dance night. They were able to socialize and make new friends from different counties. 

- Junior and teen leaders are invited but must attend with an adult or have a certified Shooting Sports adult leader they will be helping back home

By doing these popular workshops on the same weekend it will allow counties to ride share and get several shooting sports disciplines completed to bring back to their county.


