Covid-19 Protocol Guidelines and Updates for Limited In-Person Activities

Safety Standards for ALL 4-H Activities

Effective 1/19/22, the State 4-H Office and our UC ANR Risk Management Office has issued a cancellation of all indoor activities until further notice.

Do not participate in any in-person 4-H activities if you are sick or have COVID-19 symptoms or if you or someone you have been in contact with has been diagnosed with COVID-19.

Symptoms include:

- · Fever or chills
- Cough
- · Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- · Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- · New loss of taste or smell
- · Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose
- · Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Procedures to follow each meeting:

- · Check your temperature before you come. Do not come to a meeting if you had a fever within the last 48 hours.
- · Watch for others symptoms.
- · Practice physical distancing.
- . Keep a record of the meetings you have gone to, with dates. (If you or someone you live with gets sick within 48 hours, let your leader know immediately)

Face Mask Use

· Outdoor activities with youth and adults: No face masks required.

Indoor/Outdoor Physical Distancing

- Cancellation of all indoor activities until further notice. Effective 1/19/22
- · Clubs and 4-H Programming may occur only in an outdoor setting if social distancing and all COVID-19 safety protocols are being followed or via online (Zoom).


Maintain hygiene practices

The Four Leaf Clover Foundation encourages members to stay in 4H all through high school by awarding scholarships for continued education – either college or vocational school. High school seniors are encouraged to apply for a scholarship of up to \$2000. Multiple scholarships awards are made based on active 4-H participation with emphasis on leadership, citizenship, community service and service learning accomplishments. Download the College Scholarship Application form. Some browsers will open the application form, but not let you fill in the blanks. If this happens, download the pdf form and open it with Adobe Acrobat DC or another pdf viewer that supports pdf forms.

- Complete the application form and have signed by applicant, parent and 4-H Leader.
- Arrange for a Letter of Recommendation from a Community Leader or Leader from another club. (Use form that is part of the download package)
- Arrange for a Letter of Recommendation from an individual who is familiar with your leadership and service learning activities.
- Attach copies of your 4-H Personal Development Report. This year's PDR should be completed to date (including 4-H Story with emphasis on leadership and service learning) and signed by parent/guardian and 4-H Leaders. All pages must accompany the completed application. You must use the most recent California PDR long form.
- Submit the completed application on or before April 21 of the current year

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Keep in mind the following when holding a virtual 4-H meeting

-Ensure a minimum of two approved 4-H Adult Volunteers

(*If two cannot be present,) one 4-H Adult Volunteer and
another adult at least 21 years old or staff must participate) are
in place for virtual or conference call 4-H meetings and are
connected prior to members arriving.

- Members should identify themselves with their first name only.
 - Only approved 4-H Adult Volunteer leaders may host virtual or conference call 4-H meetings.
- -Keep regular attendance records, as you would normally do, at all 4-H club and project meetings.

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COVID UPDATE NEWS from Santa Barbara County

Due to the significant increase in testing the following information is being shared:

USPS at-home COVID Tests:

At this time Residential households in the U.S. can order one set of 4 free at-home tests from USPS.com. Here's what you need to know about your order:

- Limit of one order per residential address
- One order includes 4 individual rapid antigen COVID-19 tests
- Orders will ship free starting in late January

Order Test Online at COVID Home Tests | USPS

Federal Government at-home COVID Tests:

Starting January 19th, free tests will be available for every household through a newly established program of the federal government. The initial program will allow:

- four free tests to be requested per residential address.
- Tests will typically ship within 7-12 days of ordering.

Upon successful completion of this course, 4-H leaders will be certified in the shooting sports discipline of muzzle loading. You will be certified as leader trainers and are eligible to serve as 4-H Shooting Sports Leaders for clubs or counties. You may also instruct and certify shooting sports volunteers.

Class size is limited. There is no fee for this 4-H course. If you wish to receive National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association instructor certification, there is a \$60 fee.
